This past week has been a blessing for me and Heidi. We took a mission trip to Good

News Bay, Alaska the summer before we came to Faith and made some good friends there. The blessing is that the host family from Good News Bay has traveled here to Saginaw to visit the many people who have visited them over the years. It was good to see Roy, Minnie and their children here and catch up with them. Roy does many things in Good News Bay, including leading services at the church since they do not have a pastor. He and Minnie also have been visiting Lutheran Schools this week to share a little about their lives and ministry. I was fortunate to visit Valley Lutheran's chapel the day he and Minnie led it. Roy told a story both about the power of prayer but also how legalism can kill a ministry.

He and Minnie were distressed over the plight of the young people in Good News Bay, since they were not connected to Christ. So they drove around the community of about 300 people and the 4 miles of road that is there and they prayed that God would work to bring them to Christ. This took 3 or 4 hours. Afterwards, they went to church to sing songs and hymns to Christ. To their amazement, 4 young people entered and began singing with them. They were soon joined by others and then others. The church was filled and this continued for several weeks. They were making in-roads and people were being connected to Christ. Prayer did work and in a miraculous way.

This was ruined one evening when during the service, one person got up and told everyone that unless they gave up certain things, they could not be there. This drove almost everyone away and the services and the ministry to the young has not recovered since. I believe that this person was well intentioned, but misguided. Christ told the Pharisees in Matthew Chapter 9: "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. Go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, and not sacrifice.' For I came not to call the righteous, but sinners." We too are sent to call the sinners to repentance, but we do not do that by cleaning them up first; we do it by bringing them to Jesus so they can learn about him and have a relationship with him. As they grow in Christ, the Holy Spirit will do the job of cleaning them up just as he does to us sinners every day.

This story both illustrates the power of prayer and the necessity of us, as God's people, remaining humble and trusting God to do his work in people's hearts and lives. That is grace in action. As we reach out with Christ, let us rely on prayer and God's power more than we do now and let us bring Christ's love and grace with us rather than condemnation. I believe that then God will work and people will listen. I believe that is when people will hear, believe and move from death to life in Christ.

With God All Things Are Possible Denise Mosey President Women of FAITH "Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with all your might" (Eccl 9:10).

God bids us to be faithful in the tasks He calls us to do. He calls us to be members of a family (husbands and wives; fathers and mothers; sons and daughters). He calls us to be members of society (those who govern and those who are governed). And He calls us to be members of His family, the Church (those who preach and teach and those who hear and learn). Each of these callings from God places a duty on us.

As members of a family, husbands are given the duty to die for their wives as Christ gave His life for His bride, the Church; while wives are given the duty to respect their husbands and submit themselves to them as the Church does to Christ. Fathers and mothers are to raise their children in the fear and admonition of the Lord, teaching them the Ten Commandments, the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the Scriptures concerning Baptism, Confession, the Office of the Keys, and the Lord's Supper. Children are to honor their parents throughout their lives, and even when their parents are no longer alive, serving and obeying them, loving and cherishing them, and speaking well of them.

As members of society, God calls those who govern to bear the sword, that is, to punish those who do evil (those who live contrary to God's will) and to reward those who do good (those whose lives are lived in conformity with God's will). Those who are governed are to obey their leaders as to the Lord Himself, for their leaders bear the sword of God's temporal justice for a purpose.

As members of God's own family, the Church, He calls those who preach and teach to do so in faithfulness to His holy Word. To preach and teach the Law of God to convict the hearts of hearers of their sin and to encourage, admonish, and exhort them to do good works in accordance with God's will. They are to preach and teach the Gospel, the full forgiveness of their sins accomplished by Christ and received through faith, not by works. They are to administer the means of grace in accordance with the Gospel and the Word of God. They do all this for the young and old alike, for those who are near and far off. Those who hear and learn are to submit themselves to their preachers and teachers. They are support them by their prayers and their gifts.

Each of these callings from God place a duty on us. They make a claim on our presence; on our prayers; and our time, talents, and treasures. So, "Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with all your might" (Eccl 9:10). Pray for your family, your government, and your church. Give of yourself by means of your time, your talents, and your treasures to your family, your government, and your Church. That is what it means to be faithful in the tasks that God has given us. That is what it means to do it with all your might.
